New Mall 90% Leased

With a September opening date looming, developers of Rochester Hills' newest retail center say they are on schedule to deliver an alternative shopping destination for Metro Detroit consumers.

A key draw will be the Village's conveniencedriven amenities -- such as store-front parking and individual entrances -- designed to lure customers away from their typical shopping destinations, such as neighboring Somerset Collection in Troy.

Located at the corner of Adams Road and Walton Boulevard, the Village hopes to separate itself from big-box retailers and malls by combining a variety of storefronts on a Main Street decorated with fountains, landscaped parks and brick-paved walkways.

Formerly known as Meadow Brook Mall, the Village is expected to premiere on Sept. 19 as a 375,000-square-foot center, mixing apparel,
